CHIMO BANTAM TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

- ELIGIBILITY** All teams must be registered with the CAHA or its national counterpart. Proof of registration must be available upon request.
- INELIGIBLE PLAYERS** If it is proven during the tournament that a team has registered an ineligible player, that team will be automatically disqualified. The tournament executive reserve the right to take whatever appropriate action as to the fate of the team defeated by a disqualified team, as well as the manner in which the tournament will continue. All affiliated players are eligible to play if they are among your 19 players and must be declared at registration.
- ELIMINATED PLAYERS** A player whose team has been eliminated may not play for another team in the tournament.
- SUSPENDED PLAYERS** No player suspended in his regular league can play in the tournament unless his suspension is lifted by his regular league officials.
- TEAM COMPOSITION** A maximum of 19 players, including a regular goaltender and his alternate, are permitted to register for the tournament and dress for the game.
- ALTERNATE GOALTENDER** The alternate goaltender must be ready to play at all times during the game. Only 2 minutes will be allowed for the goaltender to recover from any injury. After 2 minutes, he will be immediately replaced.
- TEAM COLOURS** When the team colours are similar, the tournament officials will decide which team will wear sweaters of a contrasting colour. It is preferable that each team have 2 sets of sweaters. In this case, the home team will wear white sweaters and the visiting will wear dark ones.
- DRESSING ROOMS** Only registered players, team officials and tournament officials will be allowed in team dressing rooms. Dressing rooms must be vacated 20 minutes after a game.
- MANDATORY EQUIPMENT** All protective equipment as per CAHA Rule 99/00, section 3.
- TIMING OF GAMES** Throughout the Round Robin, Quarter Finals and Semi-Finals, there will be 3 - 12 minute stop time periods. In the event of a 7 goal spread in the third period, the clock will run continuously until the end of regulation time.
There will be a flood after each game.
2 points are awarded for a win...1 for a tie...0 for a loss.
Consolation and championship games will consist of 3 - 12 minute stop time periods.
There will be a flood at the end of the second period and at the completion of the game.

OVERTIME

During the quarter finals, semi-finals, consolation and championship games, overtime will be played until a winner is decided. Overtime will be sudden death periods of 10 minutes stop time. Ice will be cleaned at the discretion of the referee.

TIES IN ROUND ROBIN

In the event of a tie at the end of the round robin series, for any position, the following will apply to break the tie:

- If two teams are tied:
 - A) The team with most wins will take the higher position.
 - B) The results of the round robin game(s) involving the two tied teams will apply. In the event that the two teams are tied, the winner of the game between those two teams will take the higher standing.
 - C) If still tied after A and B, then the team with the best goal average will take the higher position. The goal average of the team is determined by dividing the total goals for and against into the goals for, with the team having the higher percentage taking the higher position.
 - D) If still tied after A, B and C, the team which scored the first goal in the game involving both teams will take the higher position.
 - E) If still tied after A, B, C and D, the team that received the least number of penalties during the round robin will take the higher position.
 - F) If still tied, a single coin toss will determine the higher position.

- If three or more teams are tied:
 - A) The team with the most wins will take the higher position.
 - B) The team with the best goal average will take the higher position, as first place.
 - C) The team with the second best goal average will take the higher position, as second place.
 - D) The team with the third best goal average will take the higher position, as third place.
 - E) If still tied after A, B, C and D, the team who received the least number of penalty minutes during the round robin will take the higher position.

GAME OFFICIALS

All games will be officiated by officials registered with the Northern Ontario Hockey Association.

PLAYING RULES

All tournament games will be governed by CAHA rules.

GAME MISCONDUCT

When a game misconduct penalty is assessed, the offending player will be sent to the dressing room for the remainder of the game.

MATCH PENALTIES

When a match penalty is assessed, the offending team member will be sent to the dressing room for the remainder of the game.
